TARGET PARTICIPANTS

National-level participants include Deans, HODs, Principals, and Teachers from all types of universities, colleges, and schools from all over India are welcome to reflect their views, ideas, and reflections on the given theme, and subthemes. Even education leaders who have demonstrated a vision of integrating various skills for education development are expected to join the seminar. Experts from corporate sectors in the field of digital and skilled India from all over India are also welcome to participate in this seminar.



The organizing committee invites original, unpublished thematic and research papers for presentation. Papers are solicited in two stages, first, you need to send us an abstract of your paper in just 300-words with two to three keywords. Abstracts will be screened by a review committee. After screening if your abstract is accepted by the review committee, you will be requested to submit the full paper in a timely manner. An acceptance letter will be sent after a blind review of your paper. Only accepted full papers will be invited for presentation and scheduled for presentation. Also, accepted full papers will be published as Seminar Proceedings Book with ISBN number. Authors are requested to adhere to strict academic ethics with respect to the acknowledgment of the original ideas from other sources. To avoid plagiarism each paper will be screened by the screening committee to take a plagiarism certificate. Papers not complying with ethical standards will be summarily rejected. Only forty 40 papers will be selected for presentation.

Full Paper: MS Word document maximum 3000 words excluding references.

Separate references: APA style.

Page size: A4,

Margins: 1 "Top, 1 "bottom, 1.25 Left, 1 Right.

Font: For English- Times New Roman, Font size-12, Heding 14 Bold, Line spacing 1.15. For Hindi and Marathi- Unicode with Font size 14, Heding 16 Bold, Line spacing 1.15

Outstation participants will be provided free shared accommodation subject to availability in the guest house/hostel of SNDT Women's University on a prior request basis. One presenter can present only one paper and a certificate will be issued accordingly.
