Outcome:

The major outcome of this Faculty Development Programme (CRE) was that we are going through a major change in our education system due to Carona Virus pandemic. Learning need not stop. Very good platforms can be used to learn a difficult concept of research also if we are committed to learn. Webinars need to be taken seriously with full commitment. Teachers working in disability sector need to update themselves. Understand the necessity of documentation. Many teachers are doing very good work but do not know how to document their work and how to use that data for research. This six day online programme tried to reach out to 200 special educators and professionals working in disability sector. Most of the participants felt extremely satisfied with this programme and hopefullytheir learning should translate into some research work in their own context.

Evaluation Result

- Total Rehab professionals who registered: 200
- Participants who fulfilled the criteria of getting 36 CRE Points by getting 50
 % and more in each session and 60 % and more in aggregate(some after retest):153
- Participants who could not get 50 % and more in each session and 60 % and more in aggregate (even after retest) but appeared in all session evaluations: **17**
- Participants who got 50% and more in some sessions and less than 50% insome sessions and have missed some sessions:**29**
- Participant who did not attend evaluation of any sessions:1

Feedbacks of Participants:

The participants were very happy with the organization of the sessions and the renowned speakers from different parts of the country and abroad. The participants commented on the rich learning experience they all had, and how difficult concepts of research were explained in a very simple manner. Since we had international speakers, Hindi translation was done for the ease of many Hindi speaking participants. This effort on our part was truly

appreciated. The evaluation in the form of MCQs at the end of each sessionwas initially feared by the participants but they wre quite relieved to see that it was not so difficult. Some participants made a ppt presentation of their feedback and some shared a video of their feedback during the valedictory ceremony.

The technical support provided right from the creation of telegram group to conveyimportant messages, to the online evaluation after each session and the re-test to support all the participants was very much lauded by one and all.

Feedback of Resource Person:

The resource persons conveyed their appreciation of the technical glitch free arrangements extended to them and the participants. They were veryhappy about the meticulous attention to the details right from the choice of speakers and the selection of themes for the various session. The speakerstried to reach out to each and every participant and appreciated an interactive audience who kept asking many questions after each session.

Session wise report Day 1 June 8, 2020

Keynote Speaker Prof Umesh Sharma

The talk was on Introduction to Educational Research. He explained the differencebetween research question and research problem. He shared how from a research student to research guide one has to evolve. His session gave a world view to theparticipants and got excellent reviews.

Session 1

Prof Veera Gupta spoke about Critical view of Quantitative and Qualitative Research. She brought out the nuances of the two approaches to research; qualitative and quantitative. She explained the difference and scope of both and when which approach to use.

Session 2

Prof Sudesh Mukhopadhyay discussed the Ethics in Educational Research. Participants were quite taken by surprise by what all entails the ethics part in anyresearch. Why one has to be most concerned about it while dealing with humanswas the essence of this session.

Session 3

Dr Varsha Gathoo explained Review of Related Literature: Method and Scope. Shediscussed how to review what to review and how to present it very effectively. Hersession was very dynamic and much appreciated.

Day 2 June 8, 2020

Session 4

Prof Raj Gupta deliberated on Descriptive Research: Types and Scope. The fundamentals of descriptive research were explained by giving various examples that the participants could relate to very well.

Session 5

Prof. Anita Julka explained Experimental Research: Types and Scope. She gave a comparative analysis of different types of experimental research and how and when each type is more suitable to conduct research was explained.

Session 6

Dr Hemlata spoke about Hypothesis Building. She described the various types of hypotheses. She also explained the process of arriving at a hypothesis.

Session 7

Prof. Asmita Huddar discussed Operational Definitions: Meaning and Rationale. She narrated the session in the form of a story which participants really liked and understood the difference between operational and theoretical definitions. Her session was also very interactive.

Day 3 June 10, 2020

Session 8

Prof Preeti Verma described various Sampling Techniques. Her lucid manner of explanation made the complex topic simple to understand for the participants. She explained with examples about each type of sampling and when to use which type.

Session 9

Prof Pradnya Wakpainjan spoke about different Tools of Measurement. Herdescription of survey, questionnaires, checklists etc. was very systematic and simple.

Session 10

Dr Vidya Naik described the whole process of Tool Construction. She went explaining each step in detail making it simple for the participants. Simple tools that teachers can prepare to collect some information in their class were discussed.

Session 11

Dr Jayanthi Narayan explained the Case Study Method in research. She also highlighted the relevance of this method for a special educator. To understand a child holistically Case study method is best suited was the crux of her presentation.

Day 4 June 11, 2020

Session 12

Prof Richard Rose discussed Qualitative Research: Paradigm and Scope. He explained the need of qualitative approach in special and inclusive education. Participants appreciated his insights of qualitative research. Many were motivated to take up this approach in their research.

Session 13

Dr Jhonson Jament demonstrated different Methods of Qualitative Research. His session was very much appreciated as he showed videos of focus group discussion.Due to multimedia approach the topic was understood well by all.

Session 14& 15

Dr Himangshu Das spoke about Mixed Method approach in two sessions. He gavean exhaustive explanation of mixed method designs. The difference between triangulation and mixed method design was brought out very well.

Day 5 June 12, 2020

Session 16

Dr Madhavi Dharankar described Use of ICT in Data Collection and Analysis usingSurvey Monkey. Many participants were exposed to these tools for the first time. It was a hands on learning experience for them.

Session 17

Dr Jayashree Shinde described Use of ICT in Data Collection and Analysis using Google Form. This too was a very informative and interactive session.

Session 18

Ms Chitra Wadke explained Use of Web-based Data Analysis Tools.

Dr Madhavi and Ms Chitra Wadke supervised the Practice session. This session was devoted to real time practice in use of the tools taught in previous sessions. A sample of google form was prepared by all participants.

Day 6 June 13, 2020

Session 20

Prof Shefali Pandya explained Data Analysis in Quantitative Research. She discussed various non parametric techniques of analyzing data.

Session 21

Prof. Richard Rose gave an in-depth explanation of Data interpretation in Qualitative Research. With various examples, coding of transcripts was described.Participants were very happy with the detailed explanation.

Session 22

Prof Anupam Ahuja took a vibrant session on Writing a Research Proposal. She gave all the steps involved in writing a research proposal. She highlighted the Dosand Donts and the points one has to keep in mind while applying to a funding agency, etc.

All the 22 sessions were well planned, covering an array of concepts of research in both qualitative and quantitative approach. A galaxy of speakers made it possible to reach out to our teachers in a simple manner that they couldunderstand and achieve our objective of conducting this programme.

Summary of FDPs organised in 2020-21

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) at Department of Educational Technology, SNDT Women's University is established under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MOE), Govt. of India which addresses comprehensively all issues related to teachers, teaching and professional development so as to enable them facilitate teaching-learning in the twenty first century.

National Workshop Flexi-Series on Learning Management Systems – MOODLE (July 27 -August 01, 2020)

One-week National workshop on "*Learning Management Systems* - *MOODLE*" throughpurely online mode was organized during **July 27 - August 01, 2020**.

Among **524** participants from **30** states who were certified, **50** SNDTWU campus faculty and **17** from affiliated colleges participated actively in the FDP and developed modules on Moodle LMS. (Names of the SNDTWU campus faculty are provided at the end)

Participation Details

TLC received over 1100 registrations from all over India. The final number of registrations were 1103. Out of these, 496 participants were certified for successfully completing the workshop training and 28 participants were certified for attending the webinar. Hence, totally, **524 participants from 30 states** were certified at the end of the workshop. Table 1.4 presents the state-wise details of the registered participants.

Modalities

The workshop was purely online in nature. The Moodle LMS platform was used for conducting the entire workshop. 19 groups of approximately 35 to 40 participants in each were systematically created for ease of conducting the workshop. The participants were made to participate in two roles – Student and Teacher. In the Student role, the participant played a student's role by attending the interactive workshop sessions, whereas in the Teacher role, the participant practiced his learning in the dedicated space provided for him/her on the Moodle page. For ease of identification and convenience for the organisers, every participant was given a unique number – e.g. A1.1, viz, the participant belonged to Group A1 and was the first name in Group A. In the Teacher Role, all the participants grouped under Group A were given their own "Sections" on the "Group A Teacher Role" course page on Moodle. Further, in the Student Role, 2 or more groups of participants were grouped together and a separate Student Role Course was created in Moodle.

Two sessions were scheduled for each day, which were conducted on YouTube. For every session, the YouTube links were posted on the Moodle Student page. Every session was made interactive with the participants clarifying their doubts in the chat box while watching the session. For each day, a Query Forum was created on Moodle and participants were encouraged to post their queries there and clarify their doubts. From the second day onwards, before beginning the sessions for the day, a quiz using Google Form format was
conducted on the earlier day's sessions as part of formative evaluation. These guizzes were timed.
