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Institution celebrates / organizes national and international commemorative days, events and festivals

The University celebrates and organizes days of national and international importance like Independence Day, Republic Day, Youth Day, Women's Day, etc by organizing special programs to inculcate in the students a feeling of pride for the nation and make the students understand and appreciate the freedom movement, the glorious history of the nation. A special guest who would inspire the students is generally invited to the Independence Day and the Republic Day events and apart from flag hoisting students get to display their talent in Yoga, rope malakhamb, gymnastics, and traditional rt and folk forms of India.

In addition to Independence Day and Republic Day, commemorative days like National Yoga Day and Voters Day are celebrated across the four campuses. Special workshops are organized by respective departments to create awareness about Yoga and help students with basic yoga poses to deal with problems related to stress and anxiety. Meditation is integral to the training provided to the students as part of yoga. Special emphasis is also given to the health benefits of yoga for gynecological problems.

Many of the programs also have subjects related to the constitution and rights and duties of the citizens to create awareness amongst the students about the constitution, the preamble, the national emblem, and their roles and responsibilities as active citizens in the democratic process. Some of the postgraduate programs have specialized subjects related to the constitution in relation to women and children.

The University also has active NCC and NSS units, These units help in the personality development of the students through community service. Different activities that are included in NSS are environment enrichment and conservation, women empowerment programs, social service programs, education and recreation, and blood donation. The activities that are included in NCC are annual training camp, adventure sports camp, NCC games, and Republic day participation and camp.

This year a poster competition was arranged on Women's Day be department of FRM. In spite of lockdown, various days were celebrated enthusiastically in virtual mode. Apart from this, official program of independence day was conducted at Juhu campus and republic day official function was carried out at Churchgate campus. Other important days celebrated were Marathi Bhsasha Diwas, Vijay Diwas, Youth Day and Vachan Prerana Diwas.

The Invitation Card

On June 5th, 2021, the Department of History, S.N. D. T. Women's University, Mumbai celebrated World Environment Day in virtual mode. Dr. Meherjyoti Sangle, Head of the Department, welcomed all and delivered a brief history of the world environment day. She informed about the importance of the day and shared that day is celebrated to spread awareness about the threat to the environment due to rising pollution levels and climate change. She added that by celebrating this day, we encourage awareness and environmental protection among students, professors, and the general public. The first World Environment Day was observed in 1974, giving a global platform for inspiring positive change in the environment. According to the

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United Nations, "The celebration of this day provides us with an opportunity to broaden the basis for enlightened opinion and responsible conduct by individuals, enterprises, and communities in preserving and enhancing the environment." The theme of 2021's World Environment Day is ecosystem restoration.

The Department invited two international scholars who have done research on renewable energy and the world's countries' programmes of nuclear weapons testing in remote areas and their effects on the environment in South India and the impact on agriculturists. We invited two speakers who covered in the lectures the theme of the world crisis and the role and situation of renewable energy in India. The speakers for this programme were Professor Dr. Devleena Ghosh, Social and Political Sciences, School of Communications, University of Technology, Sydney, Australia, and Professor Dr. Heather Goodall, Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences, University of Technology, Sydney, Australia. She has conducted and published research in the fields of postcolonial, gender, and environmental studies.Both worked on projects involving environmental issues. Heather Goodall is a historian who studies and writes about Indigenous, environmental, and decolonization histories in India, Australia, and the eastern Indian Ocean. Dr. Sangle and Dr. Jaswandi Wamburkar introduced the speakers.

Dr. Devleena Ghosh delivered her speech on "Renewable energy in South India and its impact on Agriculturalists". She focused on renewable energy in Western India and its impact on agriculturalists. She discussed about Pavgada in Karnataka which is home to one of the largest solar power plants in the world. This plant was built on land acquired on an innovative model that was meant to be less onerous on landowners. Dr. Devleena explained climatic justice and its relationship to grass-roots farmers. She explored the pros and cons of this model and the impact of the solar farm on the communities in the area. She questioned whether renewable energy projects need to learn from the community experiences of fossil fuel installations and work on solutions that would deal with India's energy scarcity as well as provide direct, tangible benefits to the communities most involved. She investigated how solar panels installed in agricultural farms caused the negative effects of land becoming barren and climate change due to heavy carbonization. Dr. Devleena suggested that fossil fuel production be replicated in renewable energy production.

Dr. Heather Goodall delivered her talk on Perspectives on Nuclear Histories: Marshall Islands, Australia, and India, with special reference to nuclear weapons testing in remote areas of Australia and the Bikini Atoll. She reviewed the many authors' opinions and their approaches. The topic is very crucial in both ways, from the point of the need for nuclear weapons during the cold war and how the nuclear weapons testing programme affected the environment. She explored the Australian government's opposition to the effects not only on the environment but also on geographical flaura and fauna. She discussed the British nuclear weapons testing through

the Australian government's examination of India's nuclear programme from the Pokharan Nuclear Test to the 2014s. She examined the opinions of Primala Loomba, who is a member of the India Peace Movement, that it's an anti-war and anti-nuclear demonstration in many countries. She discussed about thousands of protest marches in India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, the Philippines, a number of African states, Japan, and Australia demanding the dismantling of all military bases in Asia and the withdrawal of nuclear weapons from the region. Dr. Heather emphasised that world countries should consider the broader impacts of nuclear weapons testing and power generation. Both speakers emphasised the importance of recognising all environmental issues as urgent. The lectures were followed by the question and answer sessions. Dr. Sangle delivered the vote of thanks. Total 119 people attended this programme.

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Lecture delivered on Women's Day on 8th March 2021 by Dr. Arvind Ganachari in Department of History, S.N.D.T. Women's University, Mumbai.



Dr. Arvind Ganachari retired from Mumbai University's History Department as a Professor and Head in April 2013. He has four books and 40 articles to his credit. Dr. Ganachari is working on Marathi theatre since last fifteen years.

Dr. Meherjyoti Sangle welcome the audience. Dr. Jaswandi Wamburkar introduced the speaker Dr. Arvind Ganachari.

Dr. Ganachari in his speech argued that the 'National' theatre emerged alongside the formation of nationhood and the nation-state. His research was primarily based on the records available at the Maharashtra State Archives, the Bombay Police Abstracts of Intelligence, and the contemporary accounts. By putting his research in the theoretical framework of Michael Foucault and Antonio Gramsci, he argued that Colonialism was made possible, and then sustained and strengthened, as much by cultural technologies of rule as it was by the more obvious and brutal modes of conquest. He explained how the Maharashtrian intellectuals were equally sharp to understand sly ways of British invasion of India's culture and how they used the theatrical art very adroitly to convey to the people the message of Nationalism. He discussed about various nationalist theatrical troupes that came into being during the period under review, the names of some of them were suggestive of the purpose for which they were founded. Their names were: the Maharashtra Hittechchu Sangit Mandali, the Swajan Hitachintak Dramatic Company, the Swajan Hiteishi Natak Mandali, Maharashtra Dramatic Company, the Young National Dramatic Company, The Rashtroddhar Natak Mandali, the Aryotkarsha Mandali. Most of the managers and proprietors were Tilakites. Since all these were touring troupes, their camps

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were not infrequently places of refuse for many political activists such as Prof. V.G. Vijapurkar, V.N. Joshirao, Veer Vamanrao Joshi, Krishnaji Hari Dixit and many others.

The lecture was followed by question answer session. Nearly 90 participants were present to listen to the talk. Dr. Wamburkar delivered the vote of thanks.
